Leave the wonky charts to Al Gore. Sebastian Copeland is injecting environmental advocacy with a heavy dose of urbane adrenaline. A longtime windsurfer and mountaineer (Sixty-foot fall resulting in a broken heel? Check!), Copeland has channeled his love for pushing limits into saving the

planet's most vulnerable ecosystems: the polar ice caps. "Nothing communicates climate change as easily as disappearing ice does," says the 45-year-old Copeland.
